STUDENT GROWTH

We surveyed students at both the beginning and end of the school year. The table below shows their responses to questions regarding their feelings towards school.

I participate in class.	59%	79%
I complete homework assignments on time.	50%	61%

THE PLAN

With the data collected from both tutors and families, the Learning Bridge team has put together a plan for the 23-24 school year. Below lists ways the program will grow and improve in the coming months.

Quantitative Data In the spring of 2023 Learning Bridge piloted a math and reading assessment to gather some quantitative data. This coming year, that same assessment will be given in the fall and spring to track student's progress over the school year. The tutor will pick either math or reading based on the student's needs. The assessment is only 5 questions and only used for data and guidance in lessons.

Tutor In-Person Support Learning Bridge received feedback from the tutors that they would prefer in-person meetings more often and less virtual roundtables. Previously virtual roundtables were held once a month but in the coming 23-24 school year Learning Bridge will hold 3 in-person gatherings in August, December and May plus 2 virtual meetings in October and February.

Streamlined Resources A Google Classroom has been created to house all documents and resources the tutors of Learning Bridge may need. This includes trainings as well as student curriculum to support them in their tutorials.

Gathering Report Cards As a second way to collect quantitative data, Learning Bridge will be asking to collect pictures of the student's report cards at the end of the semester. This will not be required but will be incentivized through a prize or gift card. The data will be used to track student's progress over the course of the school year while working with their tutor.


My grammar has improved.
